# Gebrüder Weiss prolongates partnership with Bregenz Festival Logistics expert is going to support the famous "opera on the lake" for another two years / cooperation expanded into the area of HRD

During the workshops, the apprentices are encouraged to play certain scenes from Carmen themselves, slipping into various characters of that opera.

"The Bregenz Festival and Gebrüder Weiss are connected through a tradition of many years in the Lake Constance region.
